Cavalier Ambulance covers approximately 590 square miles and is one of only a few rural Advanced Life Support (ALS) services in North Dakota.

We currently have 3 fulltime paramedics.

We have 16 casual employee members.

Cavalier Ambulance currently operates 3 ambulances.

In 2009, we moved into our current location, offering a training center and sleeping quarters for out of town staff when on call.

We provide advanced life support intercepts with area basic life support units and transport patients to Cavalier, Grafton and Park River.

We provide inter-facility transfers from Pembina County Memorial Hospital to Altru in Grand Forks and hospitals in Fargo
